

Cookie Statement

This Cookie Statement explains how TRAFFIC International (“TRAFFIC”, “we”, “us” or “our”) uses cookies and similar technologies to recognise you when you visit the Wildlife Trade Portal website at <https://www.wildlifetradeportal.org> (the "Portal"). It explains how we use these technologies, and what this means for you.

What cookies do we use?

We only use first-party cookies (also known as ‘functional’ or ‘strictly necessary’ cookies) as they are required for technical reasons in order for the Portal to operate. The Portal does not use third-party cookies.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small data files that are placed on your computer or mobile device when you visit a website. Cookies are widely used by website owners in order to make their websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide reporting information.

The cookies set by TRAFFIC are called first-party cookies, and are used to remember who you are as you browse through our site (e.g. to save your login token, thereby ensuring that you aren’t treated as a new user and logged out each time you go to a new webpage).

Third party cookies – not currently used by the Portal – enable third-party features or functionality to be provided on or through the website (e.g. advertising, analytics, and so on). The parties that set these third-party cookies can recognise your computer both when it visits the website in question and also when it visits certain other websites.

How can I control cookies?

You have the right to decide whether to accept or reject cookies through your web browser settings. As we do not use third-party cookies, rejecting them will have no effect on the functionality of – or your access to – the Portal.

The means by which you can refuse cookies through your web browser controls varies from browser to browser. Therefore, please visit your browser's help menu for more information.

Will you update this Cookie Statement?

We may update this Cookie Statement from time to time in order to reflect, for example, changes to the cookies we use or for other operational, legal or regulatory reasons. Please therefore re-visit this Cookie Statement regularly to stay informed about our use of cookies and related technologies.
